SUBJECT: Arts in Public Places Program: Rosewood Park and 250 Years Recognition Plaque

RECOMMENDATION

The City Council is requested to:

- Review, consider, and approve the proposal at Rosewood Park
- Review, consider, and approve a 250-Year Recognition Plaque for the United States at Rosewood for \$2,600.00

BACKGROUND

The City of Commerce remains dedicated to enhancing the urban environment and cultivating civic pride through meaningful public art. The Arts in Public Places Subcommittee continues to explore impactful opportunities to collaborate with artists and bring creative expression to our shared spaces.

Recent efforts have focused on expanding mural installations and shaping a distinctive identity for the emerging Rosewood Arts District.

The 250-Year Recognition Plaque will be added to highlight the anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

REVIEW OF SUBMITTED ARTWORK AND SELECTION OF ART

These four mosaic art pieces will be located on four small obelisks that sit at the top of the hill at Rosewood Park.
