SUBJECT: A Resolution of the City Council of Commerce, California,

Authorizing Approval of the Purchase of 25 New Replacement Bus

Shelters and Accessories

MEETING DATE: August 12, 2025

RECOMMENDATIONS:

 Approve the purchase of twenty-five (25) bus shelters and accessories (Model: 12' Empire Transit Shelter) for transit operations in the amount of \$610,657 through the MBTA/CALACT Procurement 21-01-10/24 cooperative purchase contract.

2) Declare the surplus of existing equipment (25 shelters).

BACKGROUND:

The transportation department currently maintains fifty (50) bus shelters throughout the City of Commerce. These shelters facilitate travel on bus lines operated by the City of Commerce Transit, Montebello Bus Lines, and the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Agency. On March 15, 2024, transportation staff applied for and were awarded \$712,770 through the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority Bus Operators Sub-Committee (BOS) Associated Transit Improvement (ATI) - FTA Section 5307 competitive grant funds.

ANALYSIS:

The new modern bus shelters will feature solar LED lighting for improved visibility and passenger safety, bus arrival time displays, display panels, backless seating, and trash receptacles. Transportation staff prioritized replacements based on ridership utilization and equitable disbursement throughout the City.

Tolar Manufacturing has provided a quote of \$610,657 to complete Phase I, which involves purchasing twenty-five (25) new bus shelters to replace current, outdated shelters. Phase II shall be funded through the Metro regional bus shelter replacement program, which shall commence following the installation of Phase I and the signing of the required Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between LA Metro and the City of Commerce.

The estimated cost for installation is separate and costs approximately \$90,000. The scope of work needed to install and replace the current bus shelters will require a formal bidding process, which will be posted through PlanetBids. The work involves removing the existing bus shelters, repairing the sidewalk if necessary to meet ADA requirements, and installing the new bus shelter equipment and amenities.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The purchase will be accomplished through the Morongo Basin Transit Authority/California Association for Coordinated Transportation (MBTA/CALACT) Cooperative Purchase Contract. Tolar Manufacturing was one of the successful vendors selected through the competitive process (RFP 21-01), which began on May 15, 2021, and remains valid through January 14, 2028. The contract meets all applicable state and city procurement requirements, including competitive bidding standards.

The proposed Phase I Bus Shelter Replacement Project will cost approximately \$712,770 in FY 2025-26 and will be funded using Associated Transit Improvement (ATI) from a competitive FTA Section 5307 grant. The City Council must formally recognize the grant award in account 57-5100-37500 and appropriate the funds in account 57-8338-57010.10149 as part of the FY 2025-26 budget to proceed with the purchase and implementation of the project.
