# 1. <u>Presentation/Update from the Sheriff's Department Regarding Public</u> Safety in the City of Commerce

Sergeant Larry Villareal stated that there were 88 arrests made within the last two weeks. There was served a search warrant on an illegal marihuana dispensary, and deputies conducted a stolen vehicle operation that resulted in five arrests made.

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# 8. <u>General Plan Update/Presentation by Moore Lacofano Goltsman Inc</u> ("MIG")

Lisa Brownfield, IMG consultant, provided a status update presentation regarding General Plan the update. Following community meetings. where recommendations were made by the residents regarding improving food markets, establishing bike paths, bringing more entertainment venues, and mixed uses to the community, IMG is in the process of drafting an actual General Plan. Discussion took place on innovation districts and also live/work areas like Atlantic. which are similar to mixed uses, but not allowing heavy industrial uses, but more like small commercial uses. In response to Councilmember's Argumedo question on how the parking issues would be addressed with more entertainment venues, Ms. Brownfield stated that parking districts could be created.

Discussion took place on reducing industrial uses, especially in certain areas like Bristow neighborhood. Following discussion, it has been a consensus among the City Council to schedule a meeting 2-2-1 with the City Council in order to identify those areas to be reflected in the General Plan and bring it back for Council consideration at a later date if needed.

9. <u>Declare an Emergency for the Demolition of Existing City-owned Building</u> <u>at 6241 Telegraph Road, and Make the Necessary Findings in Support</u> Thereof

City Manager Cisneros provided an overview of the staff report.

Councilmember Mendoza moved, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Rebollo, to approve Resolution declaring an emergency for the demolition of existing 6241 Telegraph building at Road, make city-owned and the necessary findings in support thereof by declaring an emergency, authorize and enable staff to bypass the regular bidding process and receive informal quotes, and approve the following related actions: 1. Authorize staff to commence with necessary work for the demolition of existing city-owned the building at 6241 Telegraph 2.Approve budget allocation \$400,000 from Rd: and of Measure AA for preparation of bidding documents, project management, haz-mat and construction contingent environmental testing, upon appropriation of funds by Measure AA Committee; and 3.Authorize staff to bid package and Notice Inviting Bids (NIB); advertise а issue а and preparation 4.Authorize City Engineer, Transtech to proceed with the of necessary bidding documents and provide necessary engineering, construction administration coordination management, inspection, and material services on time and basis per defined contract rate: and 5.Authorize staff to retain one of the on-call environmental testing firm to testing required: 6. Environmental perform haz-mat as Approve and Assessment as categorically exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines. The motion carried by the following vote:

**10.** <u>Appeal of a Business License Revocation for A.M. Disposal</u>

Director of Public Works Hernandez provided an overview of the staff report.

Judy Mooradian spoke on behalf of the AM Disposal, and stated that they had family issues, and also during Covid business slowed down. Most of the business comes from one time requests. Discussion took place about not timely reporting, non-compliance, and other violations over years. However, the license is being revoked for not reporting any customers over the period of last year.

Councilmember Argumedo moved. seconded by Councilmember Mendoza, to approve а resolution upholding the revocation of A.M. **Disposal's** business license to operate as а non-exclusive commercial waste and recycling hauler in the City of Commerce. The motion carried bv the following vote:

## 11. <u>Parks & Recreation Department Presentation/Update on Events during</u> Covid-19 Pandemic

Parks and Recreation Director Alaniz provided a presentation and spoke about new programs and events. Mayor Pro Tem Rebollo thanked all staff for working outside of their job description and also how the day camp was a great success. Discussion took place about vaccinating staff since they have a lot of exposure. Councilmembers and the Mayor thanked all parks and recreation staff for making every effort to provide services during these challenging times. In response to Mayor Altamirano question of reopening Water Polo, Director Alaniz stated that LA County Health dept does not allow team sports at this time. No action was taken on this item. It was informational only.

# 12. <u>Weed Abatement Program - Abatement Order Directing the Los Angeles</u> <u>County Agricultural Commissioners/Director of Weights and Measures to</u> Abate Public Nuisance

Director of Administrative Services and City Clerk Shumway provided an overview of the staff report.

Mayor Altamirano opened public hearing. There were no individuals wishing to address the City Council on this item. Mayor Altamirano closed public hearing.

Councilmember Mendoza moved. seconded by Councilmember Argumedo, approve the Abatement Order directing the Los Angeles to County Agricultural Commissioner/Director of Weights and Measures to abate the seasonal and recurrent public nuisance declared Resolution under by the weeds, brush, rubbish, refuse specified having and removed from properties. The motion carried by the following vote:
