SUBJECT: On-Street Physically Challenged Accessible Parking Space for
4561 Leonis Street

MEETING DATE: October 2, 2018

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve a request to provide an on-street physically challenged accessible parking space at 4561 Leonis Street.

BACKGROUND:

On January 2018, Ms. Juana Sánchez (applicant) submitted a request to the City of Commerce (City) for a curbside physically challenged (disabled) person's parking space in front of her residence at 4561 Leonis Street. The applicant provided a completed and signed application [see Attachment 1] and proper proof of a valid disabled person vehicle identification placard [see Attachment 2]. The placard was issued by the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) pursuant to Section 22511.5 and Section 9105 of the California Vehicle Code (CVC).

ANALYSIS:

In accordance with the City's revised *Policy and Procedures for On-Street Physically Challenged Accessible Parking Spaces (Blue Curb Parking Policy)* [see Attachment 3] approved by the City Council on November 7, 2017, Staff recommends that this request be *approved*. Based on the screening methodology outlined in the Blue Curb Parking Policy in section II (Procedures), sub-section "A" (Screening), Staff conducted a field review of the subject property at 2377 Coutts Avenue and determined the following:

1. The residence has no driveway to attempt to meet the minimum driveway width requirement (point #1).
2. The driveway cannot be widened since it does not exist (point #2).
3. Existing blue curb parking spaces on this street block are located far enough from this applicant's residence (point #9).
4. Available on-street parking is adequate on this street block.

Proposed Blue Curb Parking Space Location:



4561 Leonis Street, Commerce

ALTERNATIVES:

1. Approve staff recommendation
2. Reject staff recommendation
3. Provide staff with further direction

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact if the Commission does not approve the installation of the disabled blue curb parking space. If the Commission approves the installation, the lump sum cost of painting the curb blue and installing the disabled person sign next to the blue curb is approximately **\$800**.
