A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPROVE AGREEMENTS FOR THE LIST OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS TO UPDATE TERMS AND EXTEND SERVICES

WHEREAS, as part of the FY 2025-26 budget development process, staff conducted a citywide review of active vendor contracts;

WHEREAS, the City of Commerce has contracted and administered various contracts through professional service agreements and support contracts;

WHEREAS, this assessment identified several agreements that are no longer in compliance with the City's Purchasing Policy and contracting requirements due to one or more of the following issues:

- Contract terms have lapsed, but services have continued uninterrupted;
- Cumulative costs have exceeded the previously approved thresholds;
- No formal contract is currently on file, although services have been continuously rendered.

WHEREAS, the approval of this Resolution will ensure the vendor contracts identified in Exhibit A are in compliance and will avoid disruption of critical services;

WHEREAS, the agreements found in Exhibit A are vendors providing essential services such as maintenance, GIS support, environmental consulting, accounting services, planning and zoning consulting, maintenance services, recreational services, and grant writing consulting services that departments rely on for daily operations.

WHEREAS, this action will provide a one-time authorization to prepare and execute updated contracts or amendments for impacted vendors;

WHEREAS, this action provides administrative authority to execute agreements or amendments consistent with existing service levels, under the following conditions:

- The vendor is already budgeted for in the adopted FY 2025–26 Budget;
- The service is essential for ongoing city operations;
- The vendor is not subject to performance concerns or unresolved disputes;
- Any new or revised agreement will be reviewed and approved as to form by the City Attorney.

WHEREAS, this Resolution will authorize City staff to bring forward contracts that fell out of compliance with City's Purchasing Policy and contracting

requirements and will recommend that the Mayor be authorized to execute sixty-two (62) contract agreements or amendments, in a form approved by the City Attorney within one-hundred and twenty days (120) days to formalize these service agreements.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE AND DETERMINE AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1.</u> All of the recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein as if set forth in full.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The City Manager is authorized to approve agreements, in forms approved by the City Attorney, for vendors identified in Exhibit A.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The Mayor and, when appropriate, the City Manager are authorized to execute agreements for services for the vendors identified in Exhibit A.
- <u>Section 4.</u> The Mayor is authorized to execute this Resolution for and on behalf of the City of Commerce.
 - <u>Section 5.</u> The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution.
- <u>Section 6.</u> This Resolution shall take full force and effect immediately upon adoption by the City Council.
