SCHEDULED MATTERS

11. Exide Status Update by the California Department of Toxic Substance Control

Michelle Banks-Ordone, DTSC Representative, provided a status update regarding Exide matters. Councilmember Rebollo asked why the workshop scheduled for February has been cancelled, to which Ms. Bank -Ordone responded that there is a new consultant and the soil testing results need to be obtained before the workshop could be scheduled. Further discussion took place on scoping process, why Exide is not held accountable for the clean-up, as well as when the answers to questions submitted earlier during workshops and meetings would become available for review. Ms. Banks-Ordone stated that currently DTSC is in the public comment process for draft EIR and draft clean-up plan, and all questions will be incorporated in the draft EIR and draft clean-up plan and available for review shortly.

Mayor Pro Tem Baca Del Rio requested that the meeting is scheduled with staff and DTSC representative in order to provide status update in more detail.

City Administrator Rifa suggested that the addendum published to EIR with the inventory of all questions that were presented as part of the scoping process and reader can pick a question and find it in the document.
