SUBJECT: COMMENTS ON DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (EIR) FOR THE DRAFT REMEDIAL ACTION (CLEANUP) PLAN, OFFSITE PROPERTIES WITHIN THE EXIDE PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION AREA

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### BACKGROUND:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Permitting Division is the lead agency overseeing the preparation of a Draft Remedial Action Plan (RAP) and Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) associated with Exide Technologies Battery Recycling Facility located in the City of Vernon. As part of the process, DTSC is soliciting comments on the DEIR. The comment period for the documents started in December 2016 and ended on February 15, 2017.

After considering all comments received, DTSC will select and implement the preferred cleanup alternative in a manner consistent with the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) Superfund Lead-Contaminated Residential Site Handbook.

As required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), DTSC must evaluate and consider the potential environmental impacts associated with activities planned as part of the Remedial Action Plan. To assist in the analysis, staff solicited the assistance of an environmental consultant to review the documents discussed herein on behalf of the City. On February 15, 2017, staff provided its comments on the DEIR to DTSC. Pursuant to CEQA, DTSC will create a point-by-point response to all comments received, including those submitted by the City of Commerce. These comments and responses thereto will be part of the Final EIR.
