TORRANCE PIPELINE COMPANY, LLC, OF A PIPELINE

FRANCHISE GRANTED TO EXXONMOBIL OIL CORPORATION BY

ORDINANCE NO. 582 - FIRST READING

RECOMMENDATION:

Move to read the Ordinance by title only and approve for first reading.

ANALYSIS:

On September 7, 2004, pursuant to Ordinance No. 582, the City of Commerce granted a pipeline franchise to ExxonMobil Oil Corporation to install, operate, maintain, replace, repair, change the size of, abandon in place and/or remove pipelines for the transportation storage, distribution or delivery of oil, oil products and other substances incidental to the oil industry (i.e. industrial gas, wet gas, gasoline petroleum oil and other industry hydrocarbon substances, water, wastewater, mud, steam and other liquid and gaseous substances) under, along, across or upon the public streets, highways, alleys, including waterways, and other public places in the City of Commerce for a term of 25 years.

The City was advised that on September 29, 2015, ExxonMobil Oil Corporation entered into a Sale and Purchase Agreement with PBF Holding Company LLC to purchase the assets covered by Ordinance No. 582. On July 1, 2016, the assets covered by Ordinance No. 582 were then transferred Torrance Pipeline Company LLC, an affiliate of PBF Holding Company LLC. Torrance Pipeline Company, LLC, has agreed to assume all obligations of Ordinance No. 582. Torrance Logistics Company LLC will operate and maintain the facilities pursuant to the terms and conditions of the pipeline franchise.

The City Attorney's Office has reviewed the Purchase Agreement and relevant background documents for the transaction.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. Approve the subject Ordinance, thereby approving the transfer of the franchise provided by Ordinance No. 582.
- 2. Provide staff with alternative direction.
