SCHEDULED MATTERS

9. <u>Installation of New Land Management System -Update</u>

Hollis Hodson and Emily Panter, Representatives of Accela, provided an overview of the Accela Civic Platform. Discussion took place whether applicants would be able to check status of their application on-line. Response was provided that currently the system would be only available to staff, and at a later date additional module could be added for interface. Staff would implement the system, work out details and move forward at a later date with expanding the services and capabilities of the platform. It was also stated that as it relates to the security of data, Accela platform is cloud based and data is backed-up daily.

10. <u>Mid-Year Budget Review - Amending the Annual Operating and Capital Budgets for Fiscal Year 2016-2017</u>

This item was continued to a future date.

11. Holiday Décor Program

Deputy Director of Public Works Operations Nila provided a brief overview of the staff report and options available. Discussion took place regarding on-going issues with Dekra-Lite. It was a consensus among the City Council to issue RFP and select another vendor. Further discussion took place on possible potential locations for decorations and consider if other companies could come with different suggestions for holiday decor.

Councilmember Rebollo suggested that Measure AA money cover that expense through beautification fund of Measure AA.

Mayor Pro Tem Baca Del Rio moved, seconded by Councilmember Rebollo, to terminate the existing agreement with Dekra- Lite and authorize release of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a new Holiday Decor Program and contractor for the entire program. The motion carried by the following vote:

Councilmember Leon congratulated Haig Papaian for receiving award from Industrial Council. Councilmember Leon congratulated Robert Taylor for receiving Direcotr position with the Industrial Council.

Councilmember Argumedo reported that he attended Neighborhood Watch meeting at St. Marcelina church.

Mayor Pro Tem Baca Del Rio congratulated Interim City Administrator Rodriguez on his appointment and Haig Papaian on receiving an award from the Industrial Council. Mayor Pro Tem Baca Del Rio thanked Councilmember Rebollo for organizing clean-up in Bandini area.

Mayor Altamirano invited residents to visit the Mediterranean Kitchen, new restaurant recently opened in the City of Commerce. Mayor Altamirano thanked Keith Anthony for sending him a gift. Mayor Altamirano reported that there was a coyote attack in the Rosewood area and askedstaff to initiate outreach including anarticle in the Report to the People, placing information on the website and City's social media.

Mayor Altamirano reported that he had met with Congressman who is in charge of infrastructure and if that Congressman is successful, the City might see some results in the future. Mayor Altamirano thanked entire Council for the hard work they do and making sure that the City of Commerce gets what it deserves.
