SUBJECT: Consolidation of election precincts for the June 6, 2017, General Municipal Election

MEETING DATE: April 4, 2017

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive and file staff report, and provide direction, as deemed necessary, regarding the consolidation of election precincts in the City of Commerce for the June 6, 2017, General Municipal Election.

ANALYSIS:

The City established four voting precincts for the 2015 General Municipal election. Based on the 2015 election, it was recommended that voters from Fidelia and Ferguson that previously were designated to Veteran's park polling location be allowed to vote at the Senior Center polling location. Therefore, precincts 1430030 and 1430034 were added to precinct 1430031A, which has the Senior Center location. In order to equal the precinct size for Senior Center and Batres Community Center, smaller precincts 1430032 C, D and A were added to Ruben Batres Center.

It is standard practice for election precincts to be relatively equal in terms of registered voter size, with the standard size being around 2,000 registered voters per precinct, although the number of registered voters per precinct could be smaller given the size of the jurisdiction's overall registered voter population.

The following precincts have the corresponding number of registered voters:
