WHEREAS, by removing stigma and discrimination, individuals can be comfortable seeking the help they need to change their lives for the better; and

WHEREAS, good mental health enables people to realize their potential, cope with the normal stresses of life, work productively, and contribute to the community; and

WHEREAS, supporting mental health means urging individuals, communities, and organizations to take action before challenges appear; and

WHEREAS, California's mental health system empowers people living with mental illness to effectively lead full and productive lives; and

WHEREAS, the City of Commerce encourages the community to observe this month by reeducating themselves about risk factors and resources, speaking up when someone they know is struggling, offering support and caring words to those around them, and reaffirming the importance of working together to make the community healthy.
