## **RESOLUTION NO. 18-05**

## A RESOLUTION OF CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE, CALIFORNIA, TO INSTALL A PAINTED CENTER MEDIAN LANE FOR IMPROVED ACCESS TO BUSINESSES BETWEEN EAST OF INDIANA STREET AND WEST OF COBB STREET

WHEREAS, the striping along Washington Boulevard was implemented per the plans approved by City Council on September 2, 2014.

WHEREAS, after striping was implemented, staff received requests for a striped center median lane from businesses south of Washington Boulevard between Indiana Street and Cobb Street. Also, the business requested that the curb lane parking on the south side is maintained.

WHEREAS, the proposed changes will allow on-street parking to be permitted along the south side of the street, reduce east bound lanes from 3 to 2 and add a painted center median lane between east of Indiana Street and west of Cobb Street. The addition of the center median lane will serve as an access lane for vehicles turning left into or out of businesses located on the south side of Washington Boulevard. Maintaining parking on the south side, will provide additional parking for the businesses.

WHEREAS, a Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) dated March 30, 2010 was adopted for City Project No. 1401-Washington Boulevard Reconstruction Project. On September 23, 2014 Council approved an addendum to the Environmental Document to address a number of revisions to the original document including the revision to the striping west of I-710.

WHEREAS, this activity can be carried out as additional work within the approved project budget, and will not have an adverse fiscal impact.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE AND DETERMINE AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Adopt a Resolution to install a painted center median lane, reduce east bound lanes from 3 to 2 and maintain curb lane parking on the south side of Washington Boulevard between east of Indiana Street and west of Cobb Street.

Section 2. The Mayor is authorized to execute the resolution for and on behalf of the City of Commerce.
