SUBJECT: A Resolution of the City Council Accepting the Completion of the Malt Avenue Street Racing Mitigation Improvement Project

MEETING DATE: April 3, 2018

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council accept the completion of the Malt Avenue Street Racing Mitigation Improvement Project.

BACKGROUND:

On June 8, 2016, the Traffic Commission approved implementing mitigation measures through a "pilot program" to discourage drivers from street racing (i.e., drag racing) along Malt Avenue from Garfield Avenue to Telegraph Road.

On May 2, 2017, the City Council approved the project plans and specifications for the Malt Avenue Street Racing Mitigation Improvement Project and directed staff to advertise for bids.

On August 19, 2017, the City Council awarded the construction contract to PALP, Inc. *dba* Excel Paving Company (Excel Paving), in the amount of \$106,540.

Project construction began on October 16, 2017 and was completed within the agreed time limit.

The final cost of the construction work completed by Excel Paving is \$106,540.

ANALYSIS:

Staff recommends that the City Council accept the project as complete. Upon acceptance, staff will file the "Notice of Completion" with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder for this project. Thirty-five (35) days after the recordation of the Notice of Completion, the City will release the Labor and Materials Bond to the bonding company, and make final payment of the 5% retention being withheld from the payment to the Contractor. This assumes that no "stop notices" will be filed by any of the prime contractor's sub-contractors.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No additional impact to the current operating budget, as funding for this activity has been approved and included in the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget. All work was completed in a satisfactory manner and in accordance with the project plans and specifications. The final construction contract amount is \$106,540 and adequate funds have been allocated to cover this amount.
