**SUBJECT:** Tree Maintenance on Private Property in the Village Residential Area

**MEETING DATE:** May 15, 2018

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

City Council to consider approving upholding the City's Council-established 2014 Policy regarding the discontinuance of the City maintaining trees on private property.

### **BACKGROUND:**

On October 17, 2017, staff provided background information in attached previous reports presented to Council in 2014 in which Council directed staff to discontinue private property tree maintenance services in the Village residential area. At this meeting, Council requested staff return with options for Council consideration. They are as follows:

- 1) Council upholds that property owner maintains trees on their private property pursuant to the Council-established 2014 policy.
- 2) The City maintains 3 private trees in the Village residential area with owner indemnifying the City to release the City of all liability at a minimum regarding the health and condition of the trees and any issues that may be caused by the trees to private property and utilities such as water and sewer lines.

## **ALTERNATIVES:**

- 1. Approve staff recommendation
- 2. Disapprove staff recommendation
- 3. Provide further direction to staff

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Option 1 = No fiscal impact.

Option 2 = Approximately \$1,200 per year to maintain 3 private trees. The City's former Legal Counsel determined this past practice to be a gift of public funds and recommended discontinuance of the practice in 2014. It is also worth mentioning that there are unknown potential future financial ramifications by establishing a precedent of maintenance issues on private properties which other residents may attempt to exploit.
