SUBJECT: Resolution Authorizing Execution of Program Supplement Agreement No. OR80 to Administering Agency-State Master Agreement No. 00329S for the Safe Routes to School Grant

MEETING DATE: October 2, 2018

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution Authorizing Execution of Program Supplement Agreement No. OR80 to Administering Agency-State Master Agreement No. 00329S for the Safe Routes to School Grant.

BACKGROUND:

On August 4, 2014, the City Council approved Resolution No. 14-85 entitled "Approving the Support of a Regional Grant Application for Active Transportation Program (ATP)". The ATP was created by California Senate Bill 99 and Assembly Bill 101 to encourage increased use of active modes of transportation, such as biking and walking.

In Year 2016, the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) released a "Call for Projects" for Cycle 3 pertaining to Sustainability Planning Grants, including Active Transportation Projects. The City of Commerce submitted a grant application for Active Transportation and Safe Routes to Schools Plan in the amount of \$245,000 and was selected as one of the grant recipients.

The project proposed to prepare a comprehensive Active Transportation Plan that incorporates bicycle, pedestrian, American with Disabilities Act (ADA) considerations, and Safe Routes to School analysis and planning. One of the key components of the project is a robust community engagement process, as well as a performance measurement process, to ensure sustainability of achieved results. The project location includes the entire city. Moreover, the proposed plan also includes coordination with neighboring jurisdictions.

ANALYSIS:

The Department of Transportation, Division of Local Assistance, sent a letter to the City of Commerce dated August 10, 2018 requesting a resolution of the City Council to authorize execution of two originals each of the Program Supplement No. OR80 to Administering Agency-State for state funded projects. The signed program supplement must be received back within 90 days. Failure to do so will result in dis-encumbrance and/or de-obligation of the funds.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This activity can be carried out at this time without additional impact to the current operating budget, as funding for this project has been approved and included in FY 17-18.
