SUBJECT: Allocate \$35,000 of Measure AA Funds to Fabricate and Install “NO VEHICLE DWELLING” Signs throughout the City and Install Signs and Curb Markings around Bandini Elementary School

MEETING DATE: March 5, 2019

RECOMMENDATION:

Allocate \$35,000 of Measure AA funds in order to fabricate and install “NO VEHICLE DWELLING” signs throughout the City and install signs and curb markings around Bandini Elementary School.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS:

The City Council approved a resolution during its regularly scheduled meeting on July 3, 2018 to install “NO OVERNIGHT PARKING” signs throughout the City in order to reduce the instances of vehicles parking along city streets for an extended period of time, consistent with authorization from state law.

It has been determined that additional signage related to vehicles used for dwelling purposes and human habitation is also necessary in order to clarify that the parking of vehicles along city streets and public property for the purpose of human habitation or dwelling purposes is not unauthorized, as promulgated in the recently revised Traffic and Parking regulations, pursuant to Title 10 of the Commerce Municipal Code (CMC).

The additional “NO VEHICLE DWELLING” signage will be placed beneath the “NO OVERNIGHT PARKING” signs (*see Attachment*). The additional amount for these extra signs is \$14,250.

Also, on January 8, 2019, the City Council approved the Revised Bandini Elementary School Parking & Traffic Control Implementation Plan as a mitigation effort to reduce traffic congestion during school children pick-ups and drop-offs. Staff is requesting that an additional \$15,745 be allocated in order to fabricate and install signs around Bandini Elementary School.

Therefore, the total requested amount is \$35,000, including contingencies.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The allocation of \$35,000 will be added to project account no. 43-5170-52001.14648 in order to defray the costs of fabricating and installing the additionally requested signs and curb markings.

This item relates to the City Council's specific 2016 Strategic Action Plan goal to "develop and implement a sustainable CIP Program to ensure the quality of existing infrastructure and support future plans for the City and develop and invest in infrastructure and beautification projects that support economic growth."
