**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE,
CALIFORNIA ESTABLISHING THE ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION
SCHEDULE OF FINES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE
MUNICIPAL CODE**

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2019, the City Council adopted Ordinance Number 698 adding Chapter 1.3 (“Administrative Fines and Citations”) to Title 1 (“General Provisions”) of the City of Commerce Municipal Code (“CMC”), which authorizes the imposition of administrative fines payable to the City of Commerce for code violations through the issuance of administrative citations; and

WHEREAS, CMC Section 1.13.060 states that the amount of fines for code violations imposed pursuant to CMC Chapter 1.13 shall be set forth in a schedule of fines established by resolution of the City Council, and that the City Council may impose escalating fine amounts in amounts it deems appropriate for repeat offenses of the same ordinance; a re-inspection fee shall be assessed against any responsible person in an amount established by resolution of the City Council if the responsible person does not timely and completely correct or abate a violation (with all requisite approvals, permits, licenses, and/or inspections) after having received notification from the City to correct or abate same; specify the amount of any late payment charges imposed for the payment of a fine after twenty-one (21) calendar days from the date of issuance of the administrative citation; and the City Council shall impose an interest rate established by resolution on administrative fines not paid within sixty (60) days of the issuance of a citation or order to pay by a hearing officer or judicial officer; and

WHEREAS, effective code enforcement is vital to effectuating the City’s commitment to protecting its residents’, businesses’ and visitors’ health, safety, welfare, and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, in light of the recent Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruling issued on July 22, 2020, in *Pimentel v. City of Los Angeles* (9th Cir. 2020) 966 F.3d 934, these fine amounts have also been analyzed to ensure compliance with the Excessive Fines Clause of the United States Constitution and its California State Constitution counterpart, as the proposed fine amounts are not “grossly disproportional to the underlying offense;” and

WHEREAS, certain municipal codes violations warrant higher fines because of the negative impact they have on the community’s health, safety, and general welfare. Further, the maintenance of certain unsightly conditions adversely affects the economic values of properties and structures, which in turn augments the deterioration of Commerce neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, there is a governmental interest to prevent and abate conditions that are hazardous to public health and safety. The City of Commerce is required to preserve and protect the public’s health and regulate sanitary matters, and to protect the community’s comfortable enjoyment of life and property; and

WHEREAS, individuals, businesses, companies and corporations may not have an economic incentive to stop a violation since the financial return received from maintaining the violation outweighs the amount of fine payable the City; therefore, same is a consideration in the amount of higher fines for certain violations; and

WHEREAS, some violations pose an imminent threat to the public's health and safety because of the failure to obtain the required permits, approvals, and City inspections. For example, faulty construction, electrical wiring, or plumbing constitutes real safety hazards; and

WHEREAS, violations of the Commerce Municipal Code have been listed as Schedule "A", "B" or "C", based on the gravity of the underlying offense, with progressively higher fines under Schedule "C" offenses due to the potential public safety hazards, and to significantly deter crimes that are financially motivated; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to adopt this Resolution to establish the Administrative Citation Schedule of Fines in order to enhance code enforcement efforts, deter persons from violating the City's laws, and to ensure the preservation of the public's general welfare; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding, circumstances unbeknownst to the City may warrant reviewing a request to partially waive or reduce a fine, which the City Manager, or his or her designee, shall have authority to review and make a determination on a case-by-case basis; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed public hearing before City Council took place on September 1, 2020, wherein City Council considered and reviewed the agenda report, written and oral information and evidence were received, and members of the public had an opportunity to make comment; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to establish fines for code violations subject to the issuance of an administrative citation, a late penalty amount, a reinspection fee amount, and an interest amount as authorized in Chapter 1.13 of the Municipal Code, as listed in this Resolution, as well as the Administrative Citation Schedule of Fines, attached herein as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE AND DETERMINE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. City Council of the City of Commerce hereby finds and declares that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporates them herein as findings and as a substantive part of this Resolution.

Section 2. Fine Amount – State Statutory Limitation on Fine Amounts for Offenses Punishable as Infractions. [Commerce Municipal Code Section 1.13.060(a)(1); Government Code Sections 53069.4 and 36900].

- a. Except as otherwise specifically set forth in Exhibit A, the administrative citation fine amount for a violation punishable as an infraction by the City of Commerce Municipal Code by a responsible person shall be as follows:

- (1) A fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) for a first violation.
 - (2) A fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for a second violation of the same ordinance within one year.
 - (3) A fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500) for each additional violation of the same ordinance within one year.
- b. Except as otherwise specifically set forth in Exhibit A, the administrative citation fine amount for a violation punishable as an infraction by the City's local building and safety codes by a responsible person shall be as follows:
- (1) A fine not exceeding one hundred thirty dollars (\$130) for a first violation.
 - (2) A fine not exceeding seven hundred dollars (\$700) for a second violation of the same ordinance within one year.
 - (3) Additional violations:
 - (i) A fine not exceeding one thousand three hundred dollars (\$1,300) for each additional violation of the same ordinance within one year of the first violation.
 - (ii) A fine not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for each additional violation of the same ordinance within two years of the first violation if the property is a commercial property that has an existing building at the time of the violation, and the violation is due to failure by the owner to remove visible refuse or failure to prohibit unauthorized use of the property.

Section 3. Fine Amount – General Penalty Provision. Except as otherwise specifically set forth within provisions of the Commerce Municipal Code, in this Resolution, or in Exhibit A “Administrative Citation Schedule of Fines”, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, the administrative citation fine amount for a violation of the City of Commerce Municipal Code by a responsible person shall be as follows:

1. A fine not exceeding one-hundred dollars (\$100) for a first violation.
2. A fine not exceeding two-hundred dollars (\$200) for a second violation of the same ordinance within any twelve-month period.
3. A fine not exceeding five-hundred dollars (\$500) for each third or subsequent violation of the same ordinance within any twelve-month period.

Section 4. Late Payment Charges and Interest.

1. Payment of the administrative citation fine amount after twenty-one (21) calendar days from the date of the administrative citation shall be subject to an additional late payment charge. The late payment charge shall equal fifty percent (50%) of

the administrative citation fine amount due to the City, or fifty percent (50%) of the amount remaining unpaid to the City if a portion of the fine amount was timely paid.

2. If the administrative citation fine is not paid within sixty (60) calendar days from the date of the administrative citation, the late payment charge shall increase to one hundred percent (100%) of the administrative citation fine amount due to the City, or one hundred percent (100%) of the amount remaining unpaid to the City if a portion of the fine amount was timely paid.
3. Late payment charges shall be in addition to the amount of the administrative citation fine amount.
4. In addition, interest shall accrue on all unpaid monies due, exclusive of late payment charges, at the rate of one percent (1%) per month of the total amount due from the date the administrative citation fine amount becomes delinquent until the date that all delinquent amounts are paid to the City.

Section 5. Reinspection Fee. A reinspection fee shall be assessed against any responsible person in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50) if the responsible person does not timely and completely correct or abate a violation (with all requisite approvals, permits, licenses, and/or inspections) after having received notification from the City to correct or abate same.

Section 6. Reduction of Fine(s). Pursuant to the authority bestowed upon the City Manager, as provided for in Commerce Municipal Code Section 1.13.030(f), to promulgate rules and regulations governing the provisions of Commerce Municipal Code, Chapter 1.13 ("Administrative Fines and Citations"), upon a written request by a citee in a City form to partially waive or reduce an administrative fine, the City Manager, or his or her designee, may review the reasons provided or circumstances surrounding a violation in determining on a case-by-case basis whether to partially waive or reduce a fine, subject to the following limitations:

1. At no time shall a fine, or related fees, be partially waived or reduced by the City Manager, or his or her designee, if the underlying offenses have not been lawfully corrected or abated, or if the underlying illegal offense has not been permanently ceased.
2. If the total amount of fines exceeds \$1,000, at no time shall the City Manager, or his or her designee, reduce the fine amount to less than \$1,000.
3. The determination of the City Manager, or his or her designee, whether to partially waive or reduce a fine shall be final and shall not be subject to appeal or judicial review.
4. The City Manager's authority to reduce a fine as delineated herein does not impact, amend, repeal or intervene with any provisions of Chapter 1.13, including the City Manager's authority to dismiss a citation if it is determined that it was issued in error, or with a Citee's ability to contest an administrative

citation by requesting an administrative hearing as proscribed therein.

Section 7. Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, of this Resolution is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution. The City Council declares that it would have adopted this Resolution, and each section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof, be declared invalid or unconstitutional. To this end, the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable.
