SUBJECT: Second Reading and Adoption of an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Commerce Amending Chapter 12.06, "City Trees" of Title 12, "Streets and Sidewalks" of the Commerce Municipal Code relating to administrative and enforcement regulations, as well as the imposition of recovery of City costs concerning City trees

RECOMMENDATION:

The City Council will consider and approve the following: Waive the full reading, and by reading the title only, Approve the Second Reading and Adopt an Ordinance amending Chapter 12.06, "City Trees" of Title 12, "Streets and Sidewalks" of the Commerce Municipal Code relating to administrative and enforcement regulations, as well as the imposition of recovery of City costs concerning City trees; and

BACKGROUND:

The City Council unanimously approved the revised Tree policy and introduced an Ordinance amending Chapter 12.06 "City Trees" of Title 12 "Streets and Seidwalk" of the Commerce Municipal Code at the October 6, 2020, City Council meeting.

ANALYSIS:

The purpose and intent of the Ordinance is to make amendments to Chapter 12.06 to address violations of laws and policies relating to the city's trees and provide for more comprehensive administrative and enforcement tools to promote compliance with the city's laws and policies. This will provide staff stronger enforcement tools to successfully administer the Tree Policy as it relates to City owned trees. For refence, the changes to Municipal Code are included in Attachment 1.
