## **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Argumedo called regular meeting to order at 6:38 p.m.

## **ROLL CALL**

Present: 5 - Mayor Argumedo

## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Gloria Nezahualcoya voiced regarding the Director her concerns of of Transportation's onaoina use а City car since 2018. She expressed dissatisfaction with the response to her Public Records Request, stating that the documentation did not sufficiently justify the Director's need for vehicle.

#### **CONSENT CALENDAR**

Councilmember Garcia requested that items #6 and #8 be pulled for discussion.

Councilmember Garcia additional #6 asked for information regarding amendments. Director of **Transportation** McFerguson explained Amendment #2 included environmental components that needed to be completed, and Amendment #3 modified and expanded the scope of the project, including driveway repavement, design modifications, and ADA compliance. Councilmember Garcia requested that the staff and architect collaborate to finalize these details and avoid the need for further amendments.

Director of Transportation McFerguson acknowledged that due to the project's size, some changes may be unforeseen, but the staff will make efforts to minimize the need for additional amendments. City Manager Cisneros recommended approving Amendment #4, which amounts to \$44,000 and has a specific scope identified in the staff report. Councilmember Rebollo mentioned that the funding for the project comes from federal funds. The Director of Transportation added that soil testing is required before the demolition begins.

Councilmember Rebollo made a motion to approve the Fourth Amendment to the Professional Service Agreement between the City of Commerce and Stantec Architecture Incorporated for architecture and engineering services, with Vice Mayor Altamirano seconding the motion. The motion was carried with the following vote:

AYES: Councilmembers Garcia, Lainez, Rebollo, Vice Mayor Altamirano, and Mayor Argumedo (5)

Item #8 - Councilmember Garcia inquired about how candidates are retained after completing training, specifically regarding the specifications. Greg explained that

team-building and flexible schedules are implemented to allow candidates to pursue other endeavors. In response to Councilmember Garcia, Director Alaniz clarified that lifeguards and instructor guards would be compensated during their training. Further discussion arose about acceptable IDin order to qualify for the positions. City Manager Cisneros stated that anyone lawfully allowed to work in the United States would qualify.

Councilmember Rebollo expressed support for the idea of hiring alumni during the summer and providing them with flexibility when they attend college.

Councilmember Rebollo made a motion to adopt a Resolution amending the Classification and Compensation Plan by revising the job specifications for the Lifeguard and Instructor Guard classification. Councilmember Garcia seconded the motion. The motion was carried with the following vote:
