MEDI-VAN POLICY

Commissioner Zambrano reported that drivers are now asking passengers what time their doctors appointments are over so they can be picked up at that time. Commissioner Zambrano said it is sometimes difficult to predict what time a doctor's appointment will be over. Transit Supervisor Sergio Castro reported that the process was changed about two and a half years ago when passengers were complaining that they were waiting too long to be picked up. The process now is to make one appointment for the initial pick up and one appointment for the return pickup. This helps Transportation keep better track of schedules and therefore keep better control of the system. This also allows for patrons to have the power to change their return pickup times. The return appointment times are not set in stone. It only takes a guick phone call to change a return pick up time. What Transportation would like is an estimation of when they plan on coming out of their appointments. But Transportation will always accommodate return pick up times because they are sometimes unpredictable. However, initial pick up times are strictly adhered to and this is because there are other appointments for pick up that have already been scheduled accordingly.

STAFF REPORTS

Senior Center Supervisor Berroteran made clear that we have zero jurisdiction, authority, or control over what civic organization clubs do. They are independent from the City.

15 people attended the healthy tortilla class last week. The group will be taking a trip tomorrow to Walmart in La Habra to buy healthy tortillas. They will also visit and tour the new Northgate super market that has a new juice bar, taco bar, guacamole bar, salsa bar and a coffee bar.
