Item #8- Councilmember Argumedo asked about the guidelines for this program. Discussion ensued. Councilmember Argumedo moved, seconded by Mayor Pro

Tem Altamirano, to adopt Resolution authorizing staff to execute documents for the purpose of obtaining assistance from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services. The motion carried by the following vote:

10. Military Banner Program Update

Social Services Coordinator Garcia provided an overview of the staff report. According to Social Services Coordinator Garcia, there are 47 residents that are interested in the program and the application process could start in January and close March 30, 2018. Discussion took place whether the City Council would increase allocation to accommodate all application or partially allocated more.

It was a consensus among the City Council to choose the first proposed picture of the banner layout and design, and change wording "honoring our heros." It was also a consensus to reuse banners for future years.

Tem **Altamirano** Councilmember Mayor Pro moved. seconded by approve increase budget for 30 banners. The motion Argumedo, to in carried by the following vote:

11. CalRecycle update report for Commercial Refuse and Recycling

Connie Ortega spoke in opposition of the exclusive franchise system.

Public Works and Development Services Director Babaki provided an overview of the staff report. Discussion took place regarding notification of the non-compliant franchisees. Director Babaki stated that notices were sent by certified mail. Further discussion took place about business license payment on-line or in person and checks and balances. No action was taken on this item.

12. <u>Update on Public Outreach related to Speed Humps along Astor Avenue</u>

Johncito Peraza spoke in support of the speed bumps.

Public Works and Development Services Director Babaki provided an overview of the staff report. Discussion took place on how many residences were visited by staff, and whether staff reached out to all residents on Astor avenue regarding speed humps. Director Babaki stated that residents that will be directly affected or speed humps installed near the residents were contacted by City staff in order to get residents' consent for speed hump installation.

Discussion took place about safety and possibly obtaining all residents consent for Further discussion took place regarding buses routes, speed hump installation. and it was consensus to design speed hump wide enough to accommodate buses other than emergency vehicles, so that the bus routes are no changed. Councilmember Argumedo recommended to go ahead with the installation of speed humps and reevaluate this pilot program later. It was a consensus among the City Council to go ahead with the pilot program as recommended by staff for three months, install three speed humps, notify residents about the installation, And it was a direction to identify and later reevaluate efficiency of this program. other locations for the future speed hump installation.

13. <u>Installation of a Painted Center Median Lane for Improved Business</u> Access

Public Works and Development Services Director Babaki provided an overview of the staff report. Discussion ensued. It was a consensus among the City Council to bring this item at a later date and table this at this time.

Altamirano Mayor Pro Tem moved. seconded by Councilmember Ordinance adding Chapter 9.90 to adopt Title 9 of the to an Commerce Municipal Code relating to the prohibition against certain forms of aggressive and unsafe panhandling. The motion carried by the following vote:
