Phillip J. Verbera, Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder, Community and Voter Outreach Specialist, provided a presentation regarding new voting system for March 3, 2020, election.

PUBLIC COMMENT

James Hermann opposed candidate Rebollo for the upcoming election on March 3, 2020, and spoke in opposition to cannabis.

Carl Baker spoke in opposition to cannabis.

Mirabel Mendoza spoke in opposition of cannabis, and opposed Candidate/Councilmember Rebollo.

Ann Arnow spoke in opposition to cannabis and the harmful effects of marijuana.

Cathy Morfopolous, Lenny Camara, Carlos Rosales, and Norma Larocca spoke against cannabis, and hazards associated with the marijuana.

Ofelia Avila spoke in opposition to the current Councilmembers and cannabis in the City of Commerce.

Carlos Rosales spoke in opposition to cannabis.

Alma Suarez campaigned for March 3, 2020 election and spoke in opposition to the cannabis business.

Elisa Padilla spoke in support of Candidate Rebollo.

Richard Hernandez spoke about lies by Councilmembers.

Gloria Nezahualcoya spoke in opposition of cannabis, and corruption.

Steve Viesca stated that Council bringing new businesses to the City and spoke in support of cannabis that brings jobs and revenue for the City.

Lora Logan, President of Employee Association, stated that the association unanimously endorsed one candidate Oralia Rebollo for March 3, 2020, election.
