Each recommendation has its own budget and requires different street modifications (e.g. pavement markings/repaving).

3. NUISANCE VEHICLES AND LONG TERM PARKING ORDINANCE

Staff presented a report and provided its recommendations for the adoption of an ordinance prohibiting the stopping, parking, or standing of nuisance vehicles upon any street in residential zones, and clarifying the prohibition against the long-term parking of vehicles on public streets.
