APPEARANCES AND PRESENTATIONS

1. Presentation/Update from the Sheriff's Department Regarding Public Safety in the City of Commerce

Sgt. Larry Villareal provided an update and thanked the community for the support of the Sheriff's department. Sgt. Villareal invited people to participate in Project Lifesaver. The purpose of this non-profit organization is to locate missing people,

especially those with mental health issues.

Due to the fire and protests, the Sheriff's deputies are on 12-hour shifts. According to Sergeant Villareal, patrol checks are continued in the Veteran's park area and invited residents to contact him directly to schedule a Neighborhood Watch meeting. Discussion took place about loud motorcycles and cars in the Aries neighborhood (ABS community), and the City Council recommended scheduling a Neighborhood watch meeting in that community.

6. Appeal of a Business License Revocation of East and West Disposal

Director of Public Works Hernandez provided a brief overview of the staff report.

Discussion took place regarding the performance of this particular company. Director Hernandez stated that this company operates on the business license and the expiration date is 2023. This revocation of the business license is due to non-performance.

Councilmember Soria moved, seconded by Councilmember Mendoza, to adopt Resolution upholding revocation of East and West Disposal Company's business license to operate as a non-exclusive commercial waste and recycling hauler in the City of Commerce. The motion carried by the following vote:

CITY COUNCIL/SUCCESSOR AGENCY REPORTS

Councilmember Mendoza stated that cooling stations extended hours during the heatwave as the City of Los Angeles had it until 8 pm. Councilmember Mendoza reported that he participated in the food drive organized by the Local AFSME 119 and 773, and thanked Mayor Pro Tem Rebollo for being a very active volunteer at this event.

Councilmember Soria urged staff to review guidelines and look for opportunities for the youth and seniors to start their activities and sports. Councilmember Soria spoke about the reopening of the casino and thanked Hilda Solis for the support of reopening the card room.

Mayor Pro Tem Rebollo thanked AFSCME 119 and 773 for the food distribution event and also CSOs for assisting during the event. Mayor Pro Tem Rebollo reminded that lunches are provided in Rosewood School on Monday and Wednesday and the Library hands out snacks in the afternoon daily. Mayor Pro Tem Rebollo requested a budget update regarding City's current situation.

Mayor Altamirano stated that during hot days he was helping seniors with their ACs and installing small AC units.
